Memories, enlivened by a meeting of old friends-that is a reunion and the 1979 gathering of the clan at Ojai on July 4,5,6,7 was one of the most memorable of all those of AVG and CNAC since the first one way back in 1952.

The stories haven't changed. In fact, they're better. Time has a way of mellowing history and improving it, and things you might not have thought happened now seem surely to have happened because the story telling is so good. Four days of that sharpens memories. And that is what makes reunions what they are and what makes them so good—that and seeing old friends.

There were lots of old friends at Ojai this Fourth, one of the best of all turnouts -- 48 AVG'ers and 25 CNAC'ers, a total of 73 and with wives and heirs, the total attendance exceeded 190. The bar did an SRO business, especially after the sun had set,





the dancing continued until the lights went out and if old age is supposed to be creeping up on us, there were no signs of it. In fact, "Doc Rich" looked more like a three-year-old in the Derby than an old farmer.

daughters, French and Kirsten, were
with us to accept the Flying Tiger
Pilot Award Trophy presented this

year posthumously to Bob, honoring his contribution to aviation. So the man who had so much to do with the success of reunions over a span of nearly 30 years joins an historic group of airmen on the trophy's nameplate. Joe also hosted the bar which was in pure Prescott tradition.

There was dancing and drinking far into that last night as we looked at each other for the last time this year for most of us and said final goodbyes on Sunday. We left again with great memories and that's what a reunion is all about. When you reflect that this is the 40th year since the great adventure began by drawing most of you into the early days of the war and that you are around, so many of you, still meeting together and telling the stories of those days, it makes one think of the meaning behind Chennault's message after the first reunion back in 1952 -- "You boys just let me know when and where you meet next and I'll be there!"







## AVG/CNAC AIRMANSHIP AWARD

The AVG/CNAC Associations presented a joint AIRMANSHIP AWARD to Capt. Kim Chang Kyu, for his outstanding display of airmanship in April, 1978. Capt. Kim safely crash landed his Boeing 707, in the dead of night, on a frozen lake, after being attacked and damaged by Soviet MIG fighter planes. This was accomplished without passengers or crew sustaining any deaths or injuries beyond those inflicted by the fighter attack.

The following is Captain Kim's speech on accepting the plaque:

Mr. Rossi, Mr. Watson, Mr. Caniff, Members of the American Volunteer Group and the China National Aviation Corporation, Ladies and Gentlemen:

Thank you very much for this great honor. At the time, I did not think of myself as an airline pilot, but simply as a man who was "skating on thin ice". For many years I wondered what that American expression meant. Now I know.... Because I "skated on thin ice" in a Boeing 707!

I must admit to my fears at the time. And I prayed to God. And I thank God that my prayer was answered and my passengers and crew were able to escape disaster.

To be recognized by this group is an even greater honor than you may know. I have admiration for the courage and good deeds of the men of the AVG and CNAC. It is with humility that I accept this award from you. To be honored is good. To be honored by heroes is truly much greater. Thank you very much.













