I am writing you in behalf of Mr. and Mrs. Charles H. Sharkey of 1112 Bowdoin Street, Lawrence, Massachusetts, who is most anxious to have the body of their son. Charles J. Sharkey, returned to this country from China.

Mr. Sharkey was at one time a member of the Flying Tigers, and until his death was a ranking pilot in the Chinese airways affiliate of Pan American World Airways. He was killed in a commercial airlines crash over China on January 20, 1947, and his remains removed to Shanghai, where they are now reposing at the International Funeral Directors' Establishment at 207 Kiachow Road.

Since his death, his family has been endeavoring to have his body returned to this country, but to date their efforts in this direction have been unsuccessful.


I shall, therefore, deeply appreciate your looking into this matter for me with a view toward giving me your advice and assistance on this particular case.

My dear Mr. Kennedy:

Reference is made to the telephone conversation of July 22, 1947 concerning the shipment of the remains of the late Charles J. Sharkey from China to the United States.

The Department has received a report from the American Consulate General at Shanghai stating it has been informed by the China National Aviation Corporation that the widow of the decedent is at present awaiting the issuance of a temporary visitor's visa by the Consulate General to enable her to accompany the remains to the United States. The Consulate General further states that it is now processing Mrs. Sharkey's visa case and it is anticipated she will be granted her visa and leave Shanghai accompanying the remains in the near future.

There is enclosed a copy of the consular report of death, form 192, prepared by the American Consulate General at Tsingtao, China, reporting the death of Charles J. Sharkey on January 5, 1947 at Tsingtao.
